KCAH Dragon Boat Team Re-Launched



On Sunday 21 July, dragon boat racing returned to the River Thames at Kingston, based alongside the Boaters Inn pub within Canbury Gardens.

Thanks to boating enthusiast and KCAH supporter Matthew Taylor, highly experienced dragon boater and gymnastics coach Mily Brewer got in touch and agreed to show our team the ropes.

Mily volunteered her time on two occasions for training meet ups and also coached our team on race day (as well as being one of our paddlers).

The KCAH Spurdogs put in a best time of 46.71 second with no prior on-the-water training. This landed us in 10th place out of 24 teams in the open category (teams with more than half male teammates).

Thanks to Matthew also for raising over £350 and onboarding his next door neighbours Debbie and Mark Johnstone who went on to raise almost £600!

Over £2,250 raised in total and a great day had by all. Next summer we will aim to get into the final round of six teams!

CEO's Message

"With a new government in place, we are hoping for improved support at national and local levels to intervene in homelessness. We will be keeping a close eye on things then letting our supporters know of changes and, ideally, improvements for our grassroots charity.

Historically, fewer people in need of support present to KCAH during the summer. However, this is the second year in a row where numbers have been dramatically high. We anticipate the need for a Winter Night Shelter once again this winter. This is a cost absorbed by KCAH. If you can, please get involved in our Big Sleep Out on October 4th to ensure that we can afford to shelter those in need."
